




# What is ESI?

ESCI DAY FINLAND European Student Card

- a persistent digital identifier for students
- used to uniquely identify a student across organisations and countries for Erasmus+/student mobility services
- Used for DLAs, digital nominations and ESC













## **How the ESI works in the ESC-Router**

- HEIs generate the European Student Identifier (ESI) and issue the European Student Card (ESC).
- The ESI + ESC Card Number (ESCN) are uploaded to the ESC-Router (with student consent).
- The ESC-Router stores the ESI as core reference data.
- Services validate an ESC by querying the Router, which resolves card → student identity via the ESI.
- The Router acts as the lookup and validation infrastructure for all ESCs across Europe.
- Result: consistent, cross-border interoperability, enabling any service to identify a student using the ESI.













## How does the ESI work in EWP?

- The ESI is the primary unique identifier used in all EWP digital exchanges (Learning Agreements, nominations and Transcripts).
- When an HEI interacts with another HEI through EWP, all student-related API calls must include the ESI to identify the student consistently across institutions.
- The ESI ensures **cross-institution matching**: receiving institutions know exactly *which* student the data refers to, even if local student numbers differ.
- EWP nodes use the ESI to link records, track mobilities and avoid duplication or mismatches.
- The ESI allows seamless exchanges between systems such as Student Information Systems (SIS), mobility platforms, and EWP..
- Because the ESI is persistent and Europe-wide, it enables interoperability, reduces errors, and supports automated workflows in the digital mobility process.





## ESI- one building block in a bigger picture?

EU Digital Identity / EUDI Wallet (eID / eIDAS 2) — the EU-level digital identity wallet and regulatory/trust framework (eIDAS 2 / Implementing Acts) allows citizens to store and present verified identity attributes and credentials (including documents such as diplomas certificates) across borders. Memberstate wallets must interoperate under the EUDI architecture.















#### **ESI in EUDI**


- There is no fully standardized, mandatory integration (yet) that puts the ESI inside every EU
  Digital Identity Wallet but architecturally and legally, the systems are well-aligned.
- The **EUDI Wallet** offers a natural place to store a **verifiable "student status" credential** that could carry the ESI.
- Current proposals (e.g., from EMREX) explicitly plan for bridging: wallet-based identity + student identity via ESI.
- If implemented, this would allow students to authenticate as persons (via e-ID) and also carry their ESI-backed student credentials in their wallet giving them more control and making cross-border education services much more seamless.













#### In short

- ESI stays the persistent student identifier;
- The EUDI Wallet becomes a trusted container for credentials that include the ESI, enabling cross-border verification beyond Erasmus services.

# COMMENT FROM THE INTERNATIONAL OFFICE: OUTGOING STUDENTS

- ESI implemented as requested nationally from EDUFI
  - Based on the national learner's ID (oppijanumero) that follows the Finnish student the whole life – also during another possible mobility
- ESI is currently used only for outgoing Erasmus mobilities
- Appears on the Learning agreement for the outgoing student
  - Learner's ID is fetched to the mobility system (Mobility Online) with an interface
  - Learner's ID becomes ESI when combined with the other attributes in the mobility system and printed on the Learning agreement
  - As it's in the mobility system already, it should be fairly easy to add it to the EWP-nominations.



## **INCOMING PERSPECTIVE**

- Currently not collected for incoming mobility (the data would available trough OLAs)
- We are not receiving nominations through EWP yet (a digital enquiry form instead)
- Newsletter from Mobility Online (12.11.2025): "Beyond its role as an identifier, the ESI enables students to access digital higher education services across Europe simply by logging in with their home university account."
  - o Can we respond to this at some point?



## **COMMENT FROM THE IT**

- We are not using ESI for incoming exchange students
  - No usage as of now for ESI in these cases
  - ESI from incoming student has no placeholder in SIS (SISU)
- Challenges with the uniqueness of the ESI
  - ESI may or may not be unique for a student (as a legal person)
  - ESI is not (yet) a standardized identifier used in student mobility
- Could ESI be used for European interoperability in the future:
  - Credit transfer between the universities?
  - How can we get more trust for the ESI?
  - EUDI Wallet & eIDAS2.0 possibilities for linking ESI to actual legal person?
