- Working Group to enhance Finnish HEIs' capacity to engage effectively in European HE initiatives.

Vision for Higher Education and Research 2040

Future vision for higher education and research

- The vision 2030 was drawn up in board cooperation with HEIs and other stakeholders in 2017.
- Work towards new vision was launched November 2024
- Outlining long-term development needs and outlooks towards 2040
- Supporting quality, internationality and diversity
- Exploring different alternatives and models for improving the Finnish higher education and research system on the bases of the changes in national and international operating environment



Vision 2040- discussions: How can technology best support the activities of higher education institutions in supporting the organisation of teaching, learning and education?

- Pedagogical understanding, learner orientation and technology as tool
- Roles of encounters and e-learning, sense of belonging, technology also supporting interaction
- Competence of staff
- Shared enterprise architectures, platforms, infrastructure, information resources as well as interoperability.
- Utilisation of data
- Common rules for artificial intelligence

Erasmus+ 2028-2034 proposal

Erasmus+ 2028-2034 proposal

- Standalone programme
 - Supports EEA, Union of Skills, resilience, also competitiveness.
 - 2 pillars: mobility and capacity building
 - International mobility and European co-creation still the backbones of Erasmus+
 - New elements: talent attraction both within the EU and from third countries, introducing mobility for athletes, and enabling participation of third countries.
- Flexibility and lean allocation between Erasmus sectors
 - Proposed budget for 2025 is € 40,8 billion.
 - actual growth is around 35%
 - Governance, absence of comitology
 - Denmark – Cyprus – Ireland

EU Policy Background

ESCI: a Flagship Initiative of the European Education Area

- Flagship initiative to make the **European Education Area** more inclusive, digital and interconnected.
- Facilitates learning mobility and transnational cooperation among HEIs under **Erasmus+ 2021–2027 (Key Actions 1 & 2)**.
- Supports the EU's digital transformation of higher education, in line with the **Digital Education Action Plan 2021–2027**.
- Contributes to skills mobility and recognition across borders, in line with the **Union of Skills**





Institutional Endorsement

- Recognised in **2022** as one of the four flagship initiatives of the ***European Strategy for Universities***.
- **Council Recommendation (5 April 2022)** on *building bridges for effective European higher education cooperation*
- **Council Recommendation (13 May 2024)** on *Europe on the Move – learning mobility for everyone*
- All **Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE)** holders and **European Universities alliances** commit to ESCI implementation

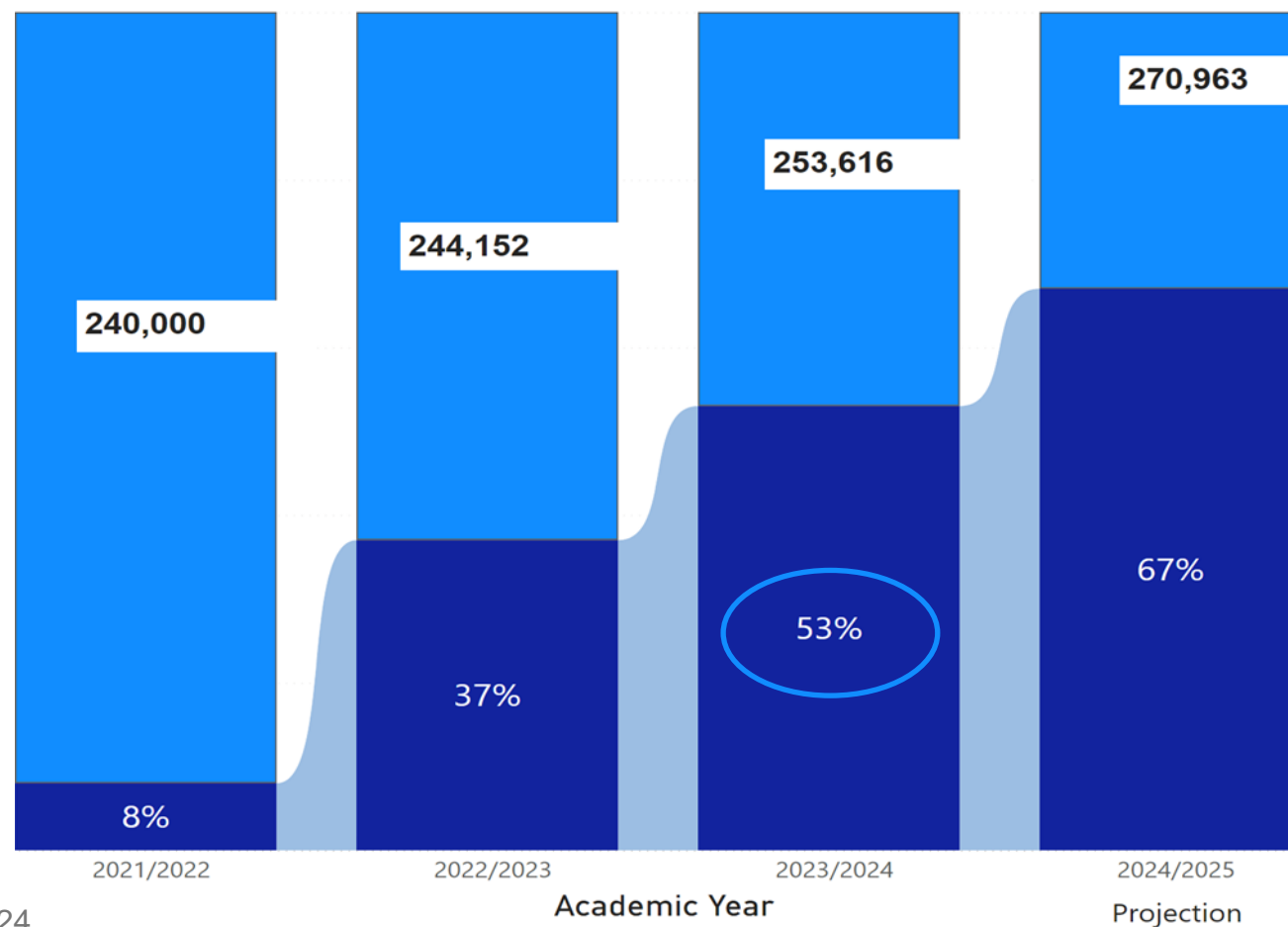
State of Play: EWP & ESC



EWP statistics

- **Over 3,000** higher education institutions (HEIs) connected across all Erasmus+ programme countries
 - **20** third-party providers
 - **38** in-house systems
 - **EWP Dashboard**: EC-funded solution
- **2/3 of all ECHE holders** exchange successfully on EWP.

DLAs : steady growth in digital exchanges through EWP

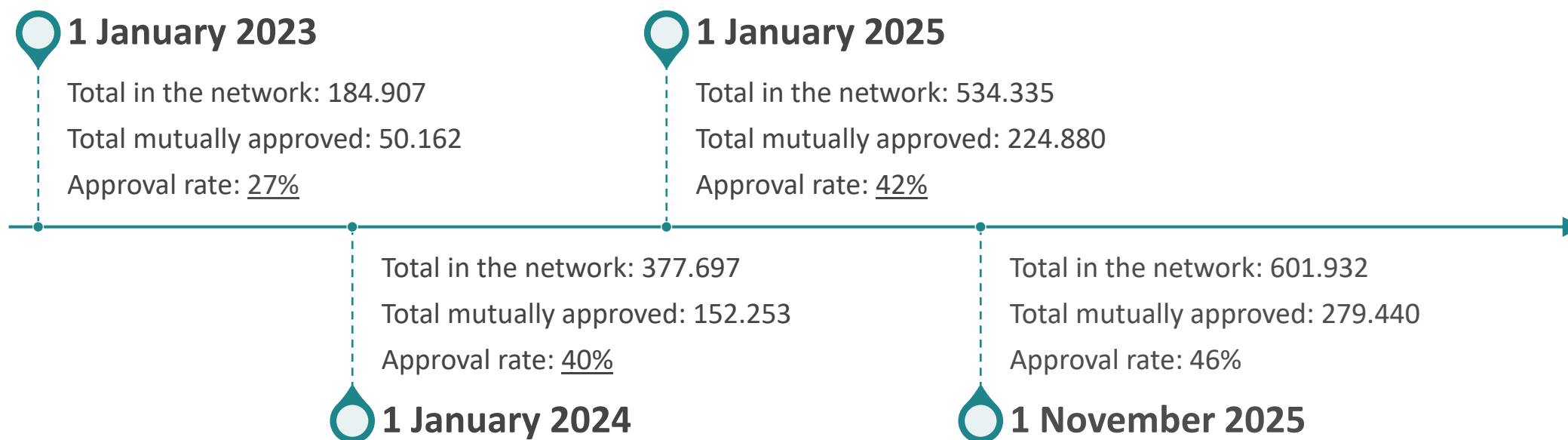


Dark blue: Evolution of the percentage of DLA signed through the EWP Network

Light blue: Total mobilities - SMS (= total LA signed) - approximately 250.000 per academic year

For the ongoing academic year (projection – 2024-25), there will be around 89K manual LAs, representing 37% of the total mobilities - SMS.

Inter-institutional agreements (IIAs) in EWP



Stable digitalisation of IIAs

- Since over a year - **around 50% digitalised IIA**
- Some HEIs renew IIA every couple of years- no need!
- Who is not exchanging digitally and why?
 - **Decentralised HEIs** where implementation of IIA is complex
 - Lack of **digital capacity**
 - Lack of **financial investment in digitalisation tools**
 - Lack of **human investment** (superhero IRO)
 - Need to **mainstream internal procedures**



The European Student Card (ESC)

The ESC is not a new card. It's **higher education institutions' current cards upgraded with a set of common visual and technical elements** that HEIs can add **via the ESC-Router**.

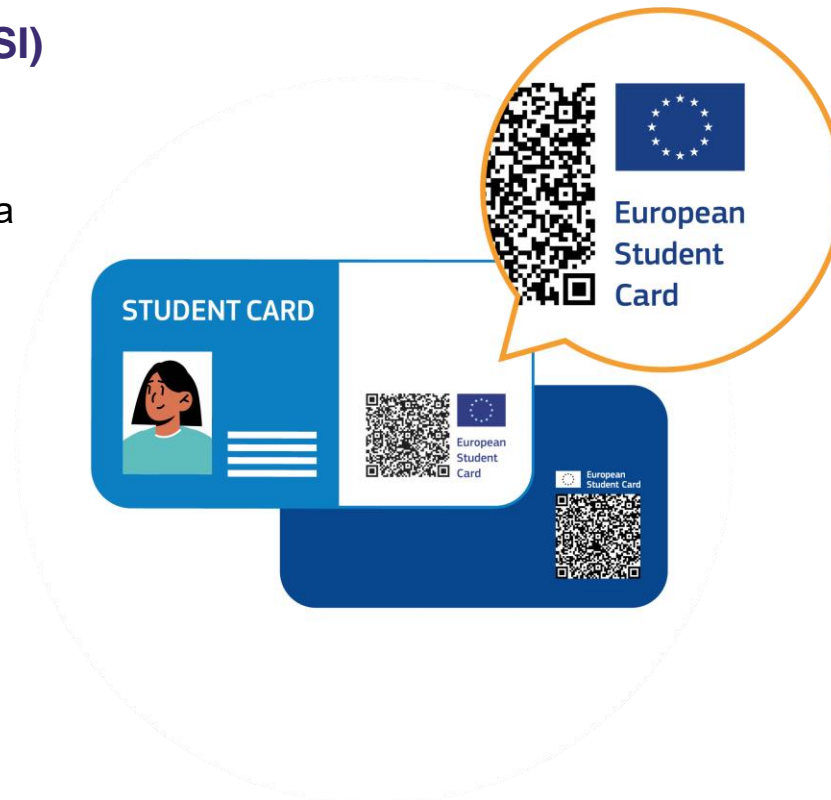
The ESC can be adapted to **digital** and **physical formats** with any type of technology (e.g., chip technology, magnetic stripe, etc.).

European Student Identifier (ESI)

A digital identifier used to uniquely identify students of European higher education institutions, linking them to a given ESC

European Student Card Number (ESCN)

A unique card identifier that serves to identify student cards belonging to a given institution and to validate them



European Student Card logo

Integrates the EU flag with the text “European Student Card” and a QR code, certifying the card’s authenticity across Europe and enabling the validation of student status

The European Student Card (ESC)

The ESC adds a **European dimension to existing higher education student cards** so students can have their student status easily recognised across Europe.



Students

- **Simplify access to on- and off-campus services** during mobility with their existing student card, just as local students (e.g., libraries, dormitories, discounts, etc.)
- Shared **European student identity**



Higher education institutions

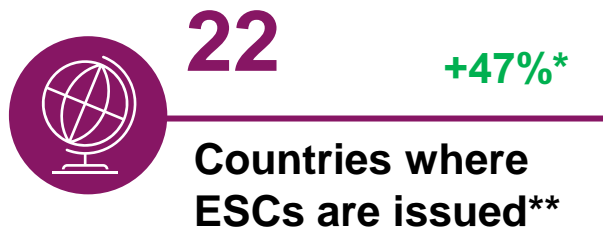
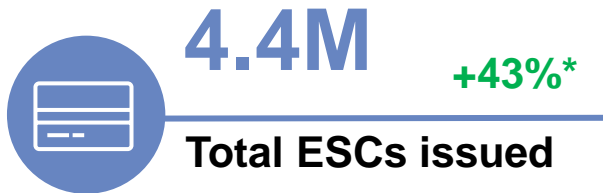
- **Securely validate the student card** of incoming mobile students
- **Support reciprocity** in service provision to mobile students.



Student service providers

- **Streamline the verification of student status**
- Gain access to a **wider network of users**

ESC state of play



* Compared to Nov 2024, after the launch of the new ESC Router. Data extracted on 16 October 2025.

** Includes countries where at least 10 active cards are issued.

The ESC in Finland

- **No ESCs have been issued in Finland yet.**
- In Finland, student cards are mainly issued and managed by **student unions.**
- The ESC implementation team is currently piloting the ESC with **LUT University and the LTKY student union** – via their service provider Slice.
- Slice is testing if the ESC could be issued through their **mobile app.**
- **If successful, this model could be replicated by other student unions and universities.**

Outlook until end of the Erasmus+ programme

Guiding principles

- **Consolidation** and reinforcement of existing processes
- **Investment** to assure continuation of services and infrastructure until the end of the programming period
- **Collaboration** with EWP+ and NTT data consortia to assure continuity



European Student Card Goals until the end of the current Erasmus+ programme period



Accelerate issuance of ESCs within and across all programme countries



Engaging service providers to bring added value to ESC holder



Launch of the ESC Service Catalogue



Roll out of digital European Student Cards

Erasmus Without Papers goals until the end of the current Erasmus+ programme

- Acceptable use policy revision and implementation (2025)
- Reach the 95% DLAs concluded in EWP network
- Gradual roll out of nominations throughout 2026
- Review ToR- ongoing work for finalisation of technical specs by end of 2025, not a priority for EC, upon to each provider/HEI capacity
- Prepare future IIA renewal scenarios (consultation and analysis)

Outlook for ESCI towards the new E+ programme

- Building on and safeguarding current investments in EWP
- Based on a thorough consultation of users and providers to establish future requirements- user led!
- Implementation based on EAC/EACEA cooperation



ESCI Champions

ESCI Champions

- Institutions that have made **significant progress** in **implementing the European Student Card Initiative (ESCI)** and commit to **sharing best practices** with their peers.
- Builds and expands on the successful EWP Champions (2023-2025).
- **31 organisations** (one per National Agency) across **three categories**
 - Erasmus Without Paper (EWP)
 - European Student Card (ESC)
 - Champion of excellence (EWP + ESC)
- Nominated by Digital Officers in each Erasmus+ National Agency
- Finnish ESCI Champion: Seinäjoki University of Applied Sciences

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State of play: current processes

Digital Learning Agreements (LAs)

- LAs in **stable release**, ensuring reliable access across the EWP Network
- Goal: 95% of LAs being completed digitally
 - **Double-digit growth** within the community (~75% digital LAs)
 - Progress - joint effort by the whole community
- LAs campaign aimed at improving LA exchanges and related challenges

Report when your partner is not exchanging



Known issues in the EWP data exchanges



Acceptable Use Policy (AUP)

AUP: Overview

- Component of the Collaboration Agreement with the nodes
- Defines the rules and principles for connecting and using the EWP Network
- In force **since July 17th**, following its presentation in April 2025 and a grace/consultation period
- Aimed to enhance the EWP experience by improving the process of reporting tickets and ensuring **timely, effective** support in resolving issues



Transparency • Cooperation • Reliability • Security • Fair Use

AUP in practice: Violations & SLA

Violation procedure

- **Notice & Clarification**
The provider is contacted about the issue
- **Resolution**
If resolved, case closed
- **Formal Notice**
The limit given to fix (clear AUP violation)
- **Public Listing**
If unresolved, provider might be listed as non-compliant
- **Disconnection**
In case of persistent non-compliance provider might be disconnected from the network



Response/Resolution Time

- **Third-party provider:** within 5 working days
- **In-house system solution:** within 7 working days

AUP in practice: Progress

AUP implementation progress

- More nodes have become significantly more responsive and proactive in communication
- Continuous monitoring in place to ensure all nodes adhere to the new AUP rules and standards
- Growing awareness and accountability among providers

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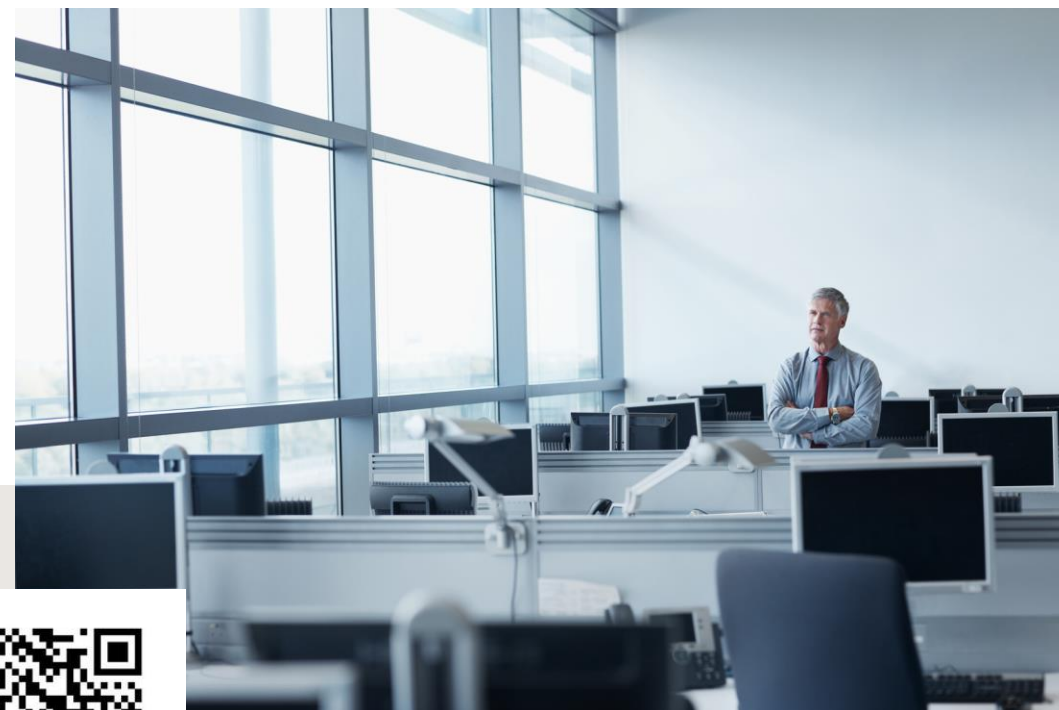
Digital Nominations

Towards a common standard

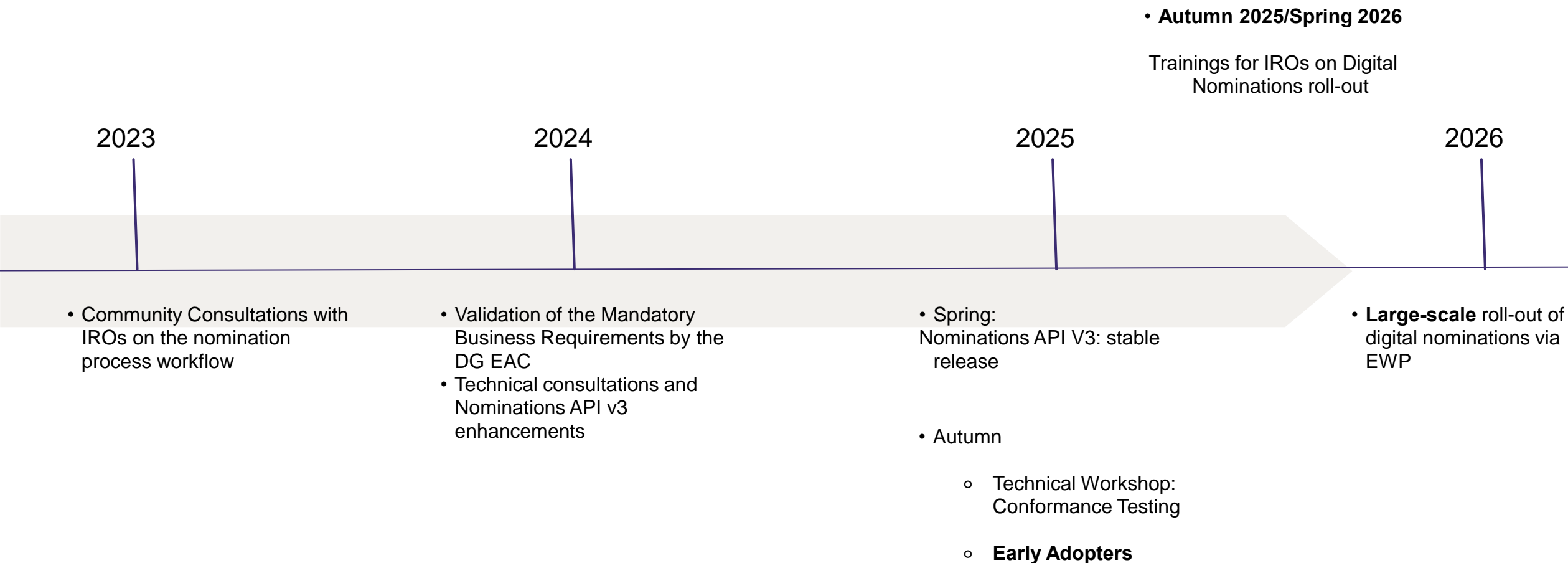
- **Long-awaited** feature - delivers a capability strongly requested by institutions

A more **unified** way of exchanging data

- - Replacement for the current fragmented practices
 - Simplification and streamlining of IROs daily work
 - Reduces errors and administrative workload
 - Improves data quality and reliability
- **Enhance IRO and student experience**



Digital Nominations: Timeline



Conformance Testing Roll-Out

- New automated testing framework (Talos) developed with **DG DIGIT**
- Validates whether EWP nodes meet technical requirements before joining the production network

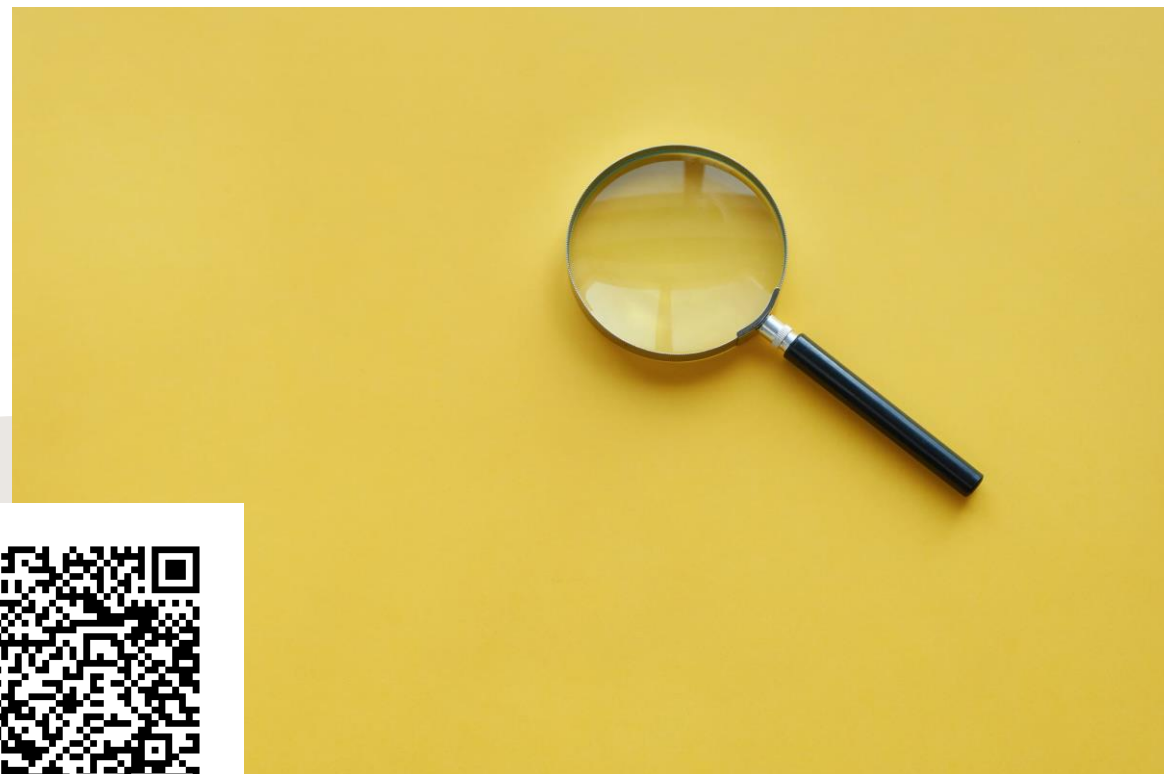
Advantages

- Quality Assurance
- Automation & Scalability
- Transparency
- Reliability & Consistency



Conformance Testing: Results

- 4 nodes have successfully passed the testing
 - EWP Dashboard
 - Masaryk University (ISOIS)
 - University of Belgrade
 - University of Salamanca
- 4 nodes confirmed development in progress (i.a., Mobility-Online)
- 4 nodes confirmed being in planning phase



Digital Nominations: Supporting materials

- **Q&A** to support the EWP digital nominations roll-out
 - covers common questions from HEIs
 - clarify the process, timelines, and technical details

What data elements does a nomination made via EWP include?

Can I include additional information beyond the standard nomination data points in EWP?

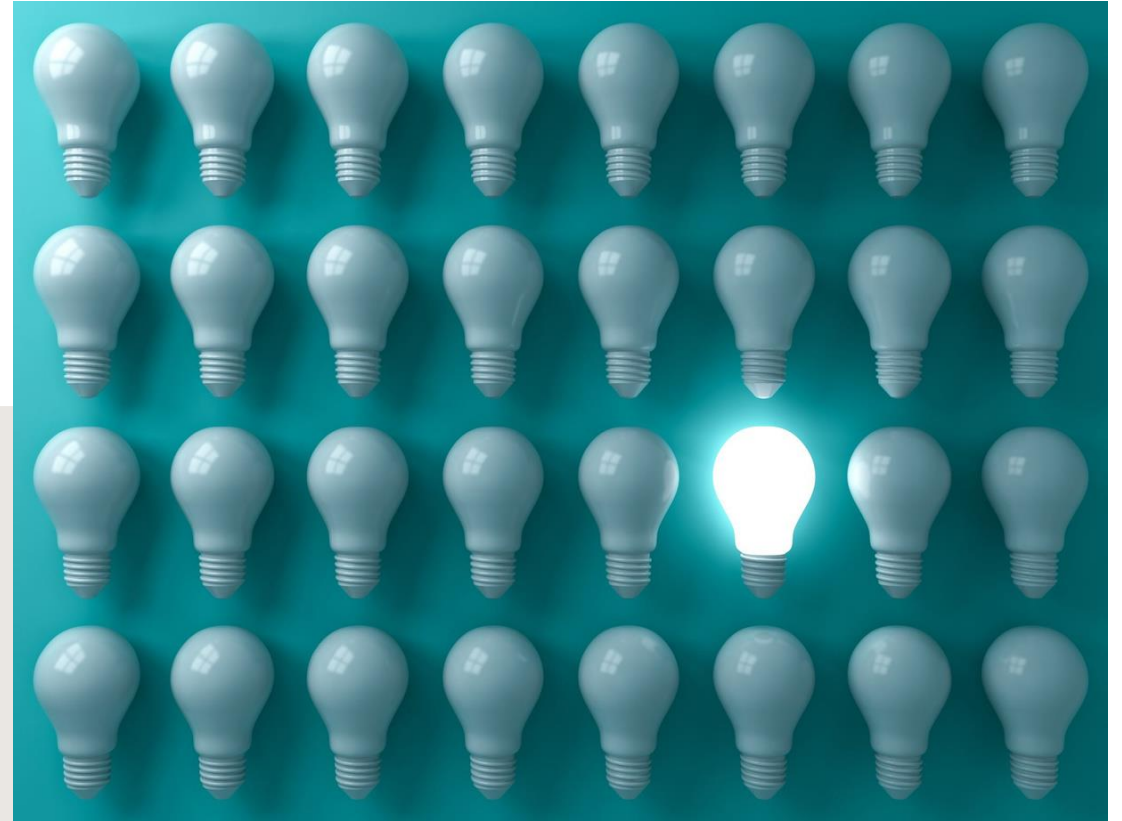
Finland: State of Play
